As a surgeon, Dr. Ray brings a unique perspective to the app development, viewing this app through the lens of both a developer and a surgeon user. As Dr. Ray began developing the Ohana One app in early 2021, he and the Ohana One team identified the needs they wanted the app to address. Their collective goal was to strengthen the relationships between surgeons, ensuring the surgeon trainees, especially those in remote areas, have consistent access to needed resources. They envisioned the app as a space to directly link mentee surgeons with their mentors and a platform to share data, ideas, and solutions.


