

At one point it was suggested that the eight broken machines be thrown out, and that four new ones be purchased, which would have significantly lowered the surgical capacity of the hospital. Tarek saw the limitations of that plan and worked tirelessly to source parts using personal connections and navigating the realities of supply chain and shipping challenges during COVID to make sure the replacement parts arrived as quickly as possible. Currently the parts are in the process of clearing customs, and the monitors will soon be repaired and





