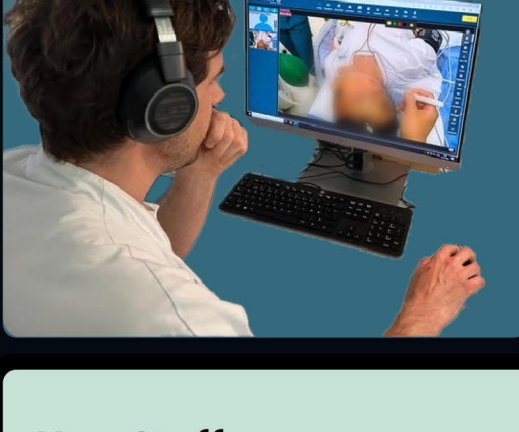

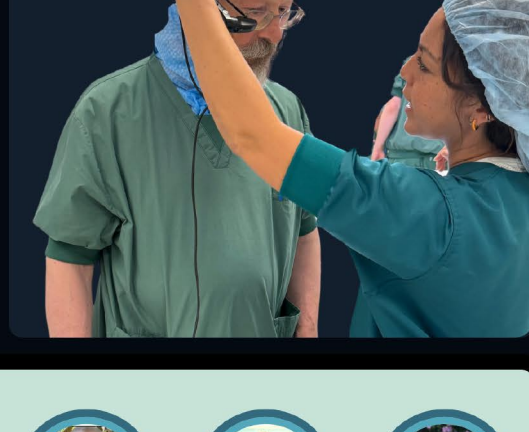


Greenland

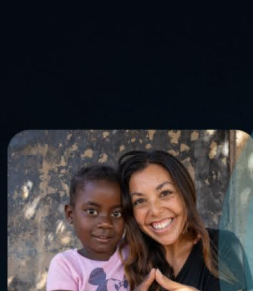
